

Kenneth E. Bodle
March 14, 1942 - October 9, 2018

Kenneth E. Bodle, age 76, of Shrewsbury, died Tuesday, October 9, 2018 at the Rose Monahan Hospice House in Worcester after a brief but valiant battle with liver cancer. He was the husband of 54 years to Patricia G. (Hall) Bodle of Shrewsbury. Born in Detroit, MI, Ken grew up in Cleveland, OH and moved to MA in 1988. He was the son of the late Kenneth Riley and Mary Josephine (Rademacher) Bodle.

Ken was retired from Sun Life of Canada in Wellesley, MA after 20 years in Sales Training and Management, and also worked for New York Life Insurance in Cleveland, OH for 8 years prior. Ken proudly started his career teaching German, Latin and English as well as guidance counseling at the high school level, and earned his M.A. in Education (Guidance and Counseling) in 1976. He was very involved in community service organizations and volunteer work in the Shrewsbury and Worcester area for the past 10+ years and received multiple recognitions for his work and dedication. He was a volunteer with the Shrewsbury Council on Aging, which included delivering weekly meals with the Meals on Wheels program, as well as volunteer work with the Senior Center in Shrewsbury.

Ken was also very involved in St. Anne's Church in Shrewsbury as a lector and one of the founding members of the St. Anne's Book Club. He was also a board member for the Boroughs Branch YMCA as well as on the Board for many years at South Meadow Condominiums in Shrewsbury where he lived. Ken proudly served in the U.S. Army and the U.S. Army Reserves.

He would like to be remembered as a man of faith, friendship and most of all a proud grandfather (Poppop), father and husband. He was a sports enthusiast, lifelong fan of the Cleveland Browns and Indians and a converted Patriots and Red Sox fan since moving to Massachusetts. He was also a huge fan of any sports teams his grandchildren have been on over the years. His commitment to volunteer work and helping those less fortunate or able in his retirement years not only brought him joy but was also frequently recognized by multiple organizations with awards and accolades. Ken's humility and warmth transcended his 6'4" stature and he will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

Along with his wife Patricia, he is survived by his daughter Karen Guderian and her husband, Bill, of Sudbury; two grandchildren, Emily (18) and Nicholas Guderian (15). He is also survived by his brothers Tom Bodle and Larry Bodle and their wives and families,

many extended family and friends who always appreciated his sense of humor, kindness and smile.

He was the father of the late Kathie Bodle and oldest brother of the late Jim Bodle. Family and friends will celebrate Ken's life on Thursday, October 25, from 4:00-7:00 p.m. at the Chiampa Funeral Home \sim The Sumner House, 5 Church Road, on the Common, Shrewsbury Center. The funeral for Ken will be held on Friday, October 26, at 10am with a Mass of Christian Burial at St. Anne's Church, 130 Boston Turnpike, Shrewsbury. Burial will be private at a later date.
